Program and Course Terminology

Terminology	Definition	
Credit Transfer	<u>Credit transfer</u> is also known as 'advanced standing' or recognition for prior learning (RPL), where students can apply for previous study from another institution to be applied as credit to a student's current degree at UNSW.	
Disciplinary Component	Students must complete 96 UOC (16 courses) of Social Science Core courses and a chosen Specialisation to satisfy the Disciplinary Component of this program.	
Social Sciences Core	Students must complete 48 UOC (8 courses) in Level 1, Level 2, and Level 3 Social Sciences Core courses.	
Specialisation Requirement	Students must complete 48 UOC (8 courses) of a chosen Specialisation.	
Free Electives	Students must complete 36 UOC (6 courses) of Free Electives.	
General Education	Students must complete 12 UOC (2 courses) of General Education courses in line with UNSW General Education Rules.	
Optional Minor	Students enrolled in the standalone program may opt to use their Free Elective courses to complete an optional minor. Courses completed as part of the disciplinary component cannot be double counted towards the minor.	
Overall Program UOC	Students must complete a 144 UOC (24 courses) across the Disciplinary Component, Free Electives and General Education courses to fulfil program requirements.	
Double Degree	Students wishing to undertake the Bachelor of Social Work (Honours)/Social Sciences double degree must complete 240 UOC (40 courses) across the 4033 Social Work (Honours) Disciplinary Component (168 UOC), and 3325 Social Sciences Disciplinary Component (96 UOC).

Bachelor of Social Sciences (BSocSci) - Single Degree (3325)

Students who have completed a **Diploma of Community Services**, **Youth Work**, **Human Resource Management**, **Paralegal Services** (AQF Level 5) will be offered credit transfer of up to 48 UOC towards the BSocSci in line with the Faculty of Arts, Design and Architecture (ADA) RPL Framework. This credit will be for:

- 1. SOSS1000 Policy and Society (6 UOC)
- 2. <u>ARTS1753 Culture, Experience and Change</u> (6 UOC) may count towards a major or minor in Sociology & Anthropology, Global Development, or International Studies
- 3. ARTS1870 Rethinking the Social (6 UOC) may count towards a major or minor in Sociology and Anthropology
- 4. Three Free Elective courses (18 UOC)
- 5. Two General Education courses (12 UOC)

Students who have completed a **Diploma of Aboriginal Studies for Professional and Community Development** (AQF Level 5) will be offered credit transfer of up to 48 UOC towards the BSocSci in line with the ADA RPL Framework. This credit will be for:

- 4. <u>ARTS1810 Foundations of Politics and International Relations</u> (6 UOC) may count towards a major or minor in Politics & International Relations or a minor in Policy, Power & Government
- 5. Two Free Elective courses (12 UOC)
- 6. Two General Education courses (12 UOC)

Students who have completed a **Diploma of Marketing and Communication, Library and Information Services,** or **Quality Auditing** (AQF Level 5) will be offered credit transfer of 48 UOC towards the BSocSci in line with the Faculty of Arts, Design and Architecture RPL Framework. Credit will be given for the following:

- 1. SOSS1001 Social Research and Society (6 UOC)
- 2. Five Free Elective courses (30 UOC)
- 3. General Education (12 UOC)

Students who have completed a **Diploma of Leadership and Management** (AQF Level 5) will be offered credit transfer of 48 UOC towards the BSocSci in line with the Faculty of Arts, Design and Architecture RPL Framework. Credit will be given for the following:

- 1. Six Free Elective courses (36 UOC)
- 2. Two General Education courses (12 UOC)



Bachelor of Social Work (Honours) / Bachelor of Social Sciences - Double Degree (4046)
