9150 Juris Doctor Study Plan – Term 1 2025 commencing

This document is designed to assist you, as a first-year student, in planning your studies within the Juris Doctor (9150) program. This document supplements information available in the UNSW Handbook (https://www.handbook.unsw.edu.au/).

Do you have a clear understanding of the program rules and program sequence?

The program rules outline the required number of Units of Credit (UOC), specify the courses you need to undertake, and provide guidance on the sequence in which they should be completed to fulfill the UNSW Juris Doctor program requirements. To successfully complete the UNSW Juris Doctor program, you must:

- complete 96UOC of core courses¹, and
- complete 42UOC of law elective courses2, and
- complete 6UOC of prescribed theory electives³.

You must complete 72UOC in the program <u>before</u> enrolling in elective courses, unless specified otherwise in a courses' 'Conditions of Enrolment'. More information about the program rules is available in the <u>UNSW Handbook</u>

How should you plan your workload?

UNSW delivers courses in three trimesters across a calendar year. This offers you flexibility with your annual 'full-time' enrolment (48UOC) as one term can have fewer number of UOC.

If you are an international student, or new to studying law, you should consider reducing your workload in your first term of your first year to 12UOC instead of 18UOC. This will require you to enrol in 18UOC in the next two terms to maintain 'full-time' enrolment.

You must enrol in *JURD7152 Introducing Law and Justice* (6UOC) AND *JURD7155 Legal Research and Writing (0 UOC)* in your first term. **Classes for JURD7152 begin in O Week**.

What resources can help guide you in planning your study?

Where a course has specific 'Condition of Enrolment' (e.g. pre-requisites, co-requisites, and/or other specific conditions) it will be listed in the course's record in the UNSW Handbook.

Use the 'Suggested Progression Plan' and 'Core Course and Prescribed Elective Offerings' tables in this document to assist you select the remaining courses in your first year.

¹ Core courses are a compulsory course within a program that must be satisfactorily completed to meet the requirements of the program. A core course covers knowledge and skills essential to the program.

² **Law elective courses** focus on discipline specific areas of the law and legal practice. NOTE: Not every Law elective available within this program is offered each year. Please check the timetable webpage for more information: https://timetable.unsw.edu.au/

³ **Prescribed theory electives** examine the theoretical context of law and application within legal practice. You are given a choice of which prescribed theory elective you enrol in.
