PHOTOGRAPHIC EXHIBITION. The Union will be staging an exhibition of photographs by students of the University which will go on exhibition some time prior to and will culminate on Open Day, September 25th. This exhibition will serve as a warm up to a Union photographic competition to be held later this year. Students are invited to submit works in the following formats - black and white and/or colour photographs, not smaller than 7" x 5" (all photographs to be mounted) or 35mm slides. Entries may include photographs entered in Opunka's competition for the best photograph taken at the Aquarius Festival at Canberra. There will be no entry fee and no limit to the number of entries that may be submitted, however all entries will not necessarily be exhibited depending on space and other considerations.
