

Liverpool Innovation Precinct (LIP)


The UNSW Founders LIP Entrepreneurship Program offers free programs and workshops to support South Western Sydney based researchers and entrepreneurs with starting and scaling their ideas. It also aims to encourage women and founders from culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) backgrounds into entrepreneurship, focusing on supporting social enterprises that solve unmet needs in communities across the region.

In August, the program hosted the inaugural Liverpool Pitch Night showcasing innovative ideas and business ventures. There were over 100 attendees and an esteemed judging panel including Professor Attila Brungs, UNSW's Vice-Chancellor.
