

UNSW Prep Program 17-19 2025

Arts, Design & Architecture (ADA) Stream Details

You will be offered a place in a Faculty of Arts, Design & Architecture degree program, subject to meeting the minimum WAM requirements below:

- > Arts, Social Work, Social Sciences, Design, and Fine Arts: A minimum of 50 WAM AND you must pass all 6 UNSW Prep compulsory courses.
- > Education Degrees: A minimum of 50 WAM AND you must pass all 6 UNSW Prep compulsory courses. Assumed knowledge: Band 5 or higher in any HSC English course or the equivalent.
- > Built Environment Programs (Architecture related): A WAM of 60 or 65 AND you must pass all 6 UNSW Prep compulsory courses.

A student entering UNSW via the UNSW Prep Program (ADA stream) will receive credit for their ADA courses.

Eligibility

> ACCESS Eligible

Assessed as eligible for UNSW's ACCESS Scheme via UAC's Educational Access Schemes (EAS) process.

> Age

17-19 years on 1 March 2025.

> Citizenship/Residency

An Australian citizen, New Zealand citizen or hold a current Australian Permanent Resident visa.

> Post-school study

You cannot study UNSW Prep at the same time as another course.

> UAC

Include at least one UNSW Preparation Program preference in your UAC application. UAC codes are: Humanities - 430100; Business -430110; Engineering - 430120; Science - 430130.

> ATAR

Have an ATAR of 50.00 or above, or be an Indigenous applicant applying via UNSW's Nura Gili Indigenous Admission Scheme.

> Additional Criteria

Provide a personal statement (using the template on the website) via UAC's 'Check and Change' facility. You may also be asked to attend a short interview in January.

How to apply

Applications must be made online via the Universities Admissions Centre (UAC), www.uac.edu.au. The Personal Statement is a compulsory part of the UNSW Prep application. It is your chance to share what interests you about the program, and what makes you a suitable candidate.

Time Commitment

- Study involves 3 x 10-week terms (February - April, June - August and September - November)
- > Time commitments are based on the subjects undertaken within each term (see Course Components).
- > At least 6-8 hours of independent study per week is recommended for each course, as well as some time each week for online learning.

Cost

UNSW Prep is fully funded by the Australian Government so for the first few subjects of your degree you pay **no course fees**.

You need to pay the Student Services and Amenities Fee (\$351 per year in 2024), which lets you access all the services for students at UNSW.

You pay the cost of any materials you need for your course.

Term 1 Academic Skills 1 (REGZ9075)

For ALL UNSW Prep Program students (compulsory)

Available Term 1

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Prior}}$ Knowledge <code>Must</code> be proficient in written and spoken <code>English</code>

Academic Skills 1 develops the fundamental skills of studying at university. This course will be based around the topic of technology.

Other Topics

- orientation to the academic system
- critical analysis skills
- note taking from lectures and written material
- $\bullet \ \text{time management skills}\\$
- · essay writing
- preparing seminar presentations
- an introduction to online learning

Social Science Skills 1 (REGZ9077)

For ALL students in the Humanities stream of the UNSW Prep Program (compulsory)

Available Term 1

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Prior}}$ Knowledge <code>Must</code> be proficient in written and spoken <code>English</code>

Social Science Skills 1 focuses on the fundamental aspects of studying in arts design & architecture subjects including how to read academic texts, understand central themes and write in a persuasive manner. The course is taught in an interactive method, so students learn through participation. The course contains written and spoken assignments which allow students to develop their reading, writing, thinking, research and spoken skills.

Term 2 Academic Skills 2 (REGZ9076)

For ALL UNSW Prep Program students (compulsory)

Available Term 2

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Prior}}$ Knowledge <code>Must</code> be proficient in written and spoken <code>English</code>

Academic Skills 2 develops the fundamental skills of studying at university. It builds on skills already learned in Academic Skills 1, and introduces students to study strategies used in social science topics. The course is taught in an interactive method, so that students can learn through participation. The course contains both written and spoken assignments including annotated bibliography, critical review and research reports which allow students to further deepen their reading, writing, thinking, researching and spoken skills. Like Term 1, this course will be based around the topic of technology.

Social Science Skills 2 (REGZ9078)

For ALL students in the Humanities stream of the UNSW Prep Program (compulsory) $\,$

Available Term 2

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Prior}}$ Knowledge <code>Must</code> be proficient in written and spoken <code>English</code>

Social Science Skills 2 focuses on further developing the academic skills learned in term one. The emphasis in this course will be on undertaking individual and collaborative research projects. It will be taught in an interactive method, so that students learn through active and ongoing participation. The course contains several written and spoken assessments which focus students towards completing the final research report.

Term 3 Choose two ADA elective courses from the prescribed Term 3 list.
