- A specialisation in Visual Arts enables students to pursue a teaching area in Visual Arts, with an option to complete a second teaching area in Graphics and Multimedia Technology see page 4-5
- A specialisation in Music, Music Pedagogy, Music Sonic Arts or Music Creative Practice enables students to pursue a teaching area in Music see pages 6-9

Students complete the Fine Arts component (96uoc) and the Education component (96uoc).

The courses that the student completes as part of their studio sequences, in the Fine Arts component, will form the 'subject content' for their chosen teaching area(s). For this reason, students must choose specific combinations of studio sequences to meet NESA accreditation requirements.
