

Submission of Manuscripts

Editorial Policies

The *International Review of Korean Studies* (IROKS) solicits and welcomes research in all topics related to Korean studies. The journal's scope includes Language and Language Education, Literature, History, Anthropology, Political Science, Business and Management, Economics, and other Humanities and Social Sciences.

IROKS welcomes theoretical and empirical papers that advance research on Korean studies. IROKS is a methodologically and theoretically pluralistic journal. Papers that are conceptual and aim to develop theories, papers that test hypotheses empirically, and case studies are all welcome. IROKS has particular interest in research addressing important issues that transcend the boundaries of academic disciplines, and thus welcomes interdisciplinary research.

IROKS also accepts short research notes and other reports on the teaching methods and development of Korean studies in various language and cultural groups. This will be published as part of Korean Studies Update. Book reviews will also be published in IROKS.

Intended to provide a forum for scholars from all around the world, IROKS aims to support the development of Korean studies outside Korea, in particular in Australasia and Southeast Asia. The focus of Korean Studies Update may therefore be regions where Korean studies is emerging.

Korean Studies Update

Papers in the following categories may be submitted to be published in Korean Studies Update:

- Discussion papers or reports on issues related to either Korean-language or Korean studies education, especially those written from non-Korean perspectives;
- Reports on the current state and/or developments of research and/or education in Korean studies in a country or region outside the Republic of Korea;
- Short research notes on Korean studies; and
- Any other relevant reports on Korean studies.

Book Reviews

A book review should contain, at a minimum, a brief synopsis of the book, including its main thesis and conclusion. It should analyse the book by comparing it with other major works in the field concerned and indicate its relevance for students of Korean studies.

Submission of Manuscripts

Authors are requested to submit their papers in electronic form to Editors-in-Chief at iroks@unsw.edu.au. Both a MS Word for Windows (for IBM-PC) file and a PDF file should be submitted. If a PDF file cannot be created, a hard copy of the paper should be posted, in addition to a MS Word for Windows file, to International Review of Korean Studies, Korea Research Institute, Room 1015, Quadrangle Building, University of New South Wales, Sydney NSW 2052, Australia (Tel: 61-2-9385-4466; Fax: 61-2-9385-5622; E-mail: iroks@unsw.edu.au). The MS Word file will then be converted to a PDF file when sent out for review.

Manuscripts are reviewed with the understanding that they:

- are substantially new;

- have not been previously published in whole (including book chapters) or in part (including exhibits);
- have not been previously accepted for publication;
- are not under consideration by any other publisher; and
- will not be submitted elsewhere until a decision is reached regarding their publication in IROKS.

The only exception is papers in conference proceedings, as long as they represent work in progress towards the manuscripts submitted to IROKS. In that case, the Editor-in-Chief will eventually need to know where the papers were presented. IROKS will have the copyright to all the articles that it publishes.

Panel Editorial Board

The editorial board comprises four panels: Language and Linguistics; Humanities; Social Sciences; and Business and Economics. Each panel consists of a Panel Managing Editor and Panel Editorial Board Members.

Authors are required to indicate which panel is best suited for their papers. The Panel Managing Editors will assign two to four reviewers to a manuscript. Papers which may not readily be assigned to any of the four panels are also welcome. In this case, authors should state the specific research discipline of their papers. The Editors-in-Chief will invite special panel editors for these papers.

Short research notes, reports related to teaching, and reports on Korean studies will be handled by the Managing Editor for Korean Studies Update.

Manuscript Files

Before submitting an electronic copy of a manuscript, make sure that:

- it is clear of all possible viruses;
- it contains nothing but the manuscript;
- it does not contain any information identifying the author(s) of the manuscript, including acknowledgements and contact details, except on the title page (Make sure to remove all such information from the "Summary" of the Word file. This can be accessed by clicking the "File" menu, then "Properties", and finally the "Summary" tab);
- it is placed in one file; and
- all pages, including the title and abstract pages, are numbered using the automatic page numbering system of the Word.

Copyright

The copyright of manuscripts belongs to the Korea Research Institute. All submitted manuscripts must be accompanied by a statement signed by all authors that they are original, are not under consideration elsewhere, and have not previously been published.

Proofs and Offprints

The corresponding author will electronically receive page proofs, which must be carefully checked and returned within three days of receipt. An offprint order form is sent with the proofs. Charges will apply to reprints ordered at a later date.
