Terminology	Definition
<b>Program compulsory core courses</b>	Courses which students must complete under their enrolled degree e.g. Bachelor of Commerce / Bachelor of Economics 3521
<b>Commerce Major</b>	A sequence of approved courses (48UOC) in an approved discipline stream offered by the UNSW Business School (See Appendix A.), containing at least 18UOC at level 3. (Note that the 48 UOC includes the first disciplinary course(s) in the Core (Compulsory or Flexible). This means that, for the majority of majors, students will complete 42UOC in specified disciplinary courses outside the core.)
<b>Economics Major</b>	Students must complete at least one major in Economics, Econometrics or Financial Economics consisting of 60UOC (see Appendix B). The 60UOC includes 36UOC from the compulsory first and second year core courses. (ACCT1501 and ECON1401 do not count towards an Economics major.) Students must complete at least three (3) level 3 courses (numbered 3XXX).
<b>Economics Electives</b>	Account for 12UOC (2 courses) from the School of Economics to ensure a student completes a minimum of 84UOC of Economics courses within the School of Economics.
<b>UNSW Business School Elective OR Commerce Minor</b>	Account for 30UOC (5 courses). Students are free to use the UNSW Business School electives to complete courses from any Faculty or to complete a Commerce minor, however they need to be mindful of the program limit on Level 1 courses (60UOC) when making their selection. Students wishing to complete a second Commerce major may result in completing additional UOC. GEN courses cannot count as Free electives.
<b>General Education</b>	Account for 12UOC (2 courses) and are to be taken outside the UNSW Business School. Please note that students enrolled in programs within the UNSW Business School cannot take General Education courses offered by the UNSW Business School (i.e. GENC code). These restrictions also apply to the following courses: GENL2015 The World of Work; GENL2021 An Introduction to the Australian Legal System; GENL2032 Cyberspace Law 2.0; GENL5021 Business Law Basics. - **Students must complete at least one major in Economics, Econometrics or Financial Economics.**
- **Overlapping requirements:** If you choose to do two Economics majors that have overlapping compulsory core courses, you do not need to complete them twice. However, if the two Economics majors have overlapping compulsory major specific courses, then you should only count the major specific course towards one Economics major and choose to do a major elective course of the same level in the other Economics major. Please consult the Business School Student Centre if you have any further questions.
